

FEAST OF TABERNACLES

The Feast of Tabernacles or Booths (Tents) was initially introduced to the Hebrews during their 40 year sojourn in the Wilderness of Sin. God instructed the Israelites to observe the Feast of Tabernacles by building and living in Booths for seven days, to remember the Exodus from Egypt and that the Israelites lived in Booths when God brought them out of Egypt. The Eternal dwelt with His people and during this time He taught them of His ways and they celebrated; God, resolving to manifest Himself in a peculiar manner present among them, He thought good to dwell amongst them in a visible and external manner; and therefore, while they were in the wilderness, and sojourned in tents, He would have a Tent or Tabernacle built, to sojourn with them also.

Later, the Festival was held in the city of Shiloh, the place that God chose to place His name, and later changed to Jerusalem. This was a Harvest Festival for rejoicing in the blessings of God. Deuteronomy 16:13-15 instructed the Israelites to gather in the harvest of their granaries and vineyards and rejoice for God will bless the increase of your hands. People brought their tithes of the land - - food, wine, and animals - - to the Temple and rejoiced in the name of God.

This Festival pictures the seventh millennial day or 1,000-year period of human history—coming just ahead of us. Even Yeshua indicated strongly that his life in the flesh was a foretaste of his future return to keep this Feast once more with his people in the Millennium. John 1:14 "And the Word became flesh, and tabernacled among us. And we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and of truth." The modern Feast, just as the Ancient Feasts of Israel, is a time of rejoicing, a time to hear the truth of God's word and how to live as His people. It is a time for deeper examination of the Truth of His Word and a time to come together and become closer as people of God for we are striving toward citizenship in the Kingdom of God which the Feast ultimately pictures in the modern setting.

The Feast is a time of togetherness for God's People. A love that transcends any love we have ever known as human beings. This is a time to learn of the Love of God. I John 4:7-8 "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God, and everyone who loves has been born of God, and knows God. (8) The one who

does not love has not known God." For God is love. After all, how did Christ say that the world would identify his people? John 13:35 "This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The Feast is a great occasion and opportunity to get to know each other and learn more about God and His Plan. A time of rejoicing, singing, praying, and sharing God's truth. Through sharing this truth and deepening our commitment to that truth and to each other, we all will draw closer as God's people, growing closer through common ideas, common values, and a respect for who we are in Christ.

I pray that this Feast will be the catalyst for growth for each other and a larger church community of seekers of God's way of life in the Chicago land area.

The Robie House



The Robie House on the University of Chicago campus is considered one of the most important buildings in the history of American architecture. It was created by Frank Lloyd Wright for his client Frederick C. Robie, a forward-thinking businessman. Designed in Wright's Oak Park studio in 1908 and completed in 1910, the building is both a masterpiece of the Prairie style and renowned as a forerunner of modernism in architecture. Tours of the site offer both a first-hand experience of its amazingly contemporary spaces and the current restoration work that is returning the house to its original appearance.
